

REVISED RULES AND REGULATIONS OF OVER THE HILL GANG SKI TEAM, INC.

Pursuant to the provisions of the Amended By-Laws of Over The Hill Gang Ski Team, Inc. (hereinafter "OHG"), the following rules and regulations are adopted by the Board of Advisors (hereinafter "Board") and Copper Mountain, Inc. (hereinafter "Copper Mountain"), for the general function and operation of OHG.

I. - Membership

1.1 Eligibility for membership and types of membership and voting rights are set forth in the Amended By-Laws.

1.2 Dues and time period for membership are to be set by Copper Mountain.

1.3 A copy of the Amended By-Laws and the Revised Rules and Regulations shall be available on the OHG website. Upon written request by a member to Copper Mountain, a copy of the Amended By-Laws and the Revised Rules and Regulations will be forwarded to the requesting member. Notice of changes in the Amended By-Laws or in the Revised Rules and Regulations shall be published in the newsletter following their effective date.

1.4 All members upon payment of their dues each season will receive a current-year sticker to update their current nametag. Extra nametags may be acquired through the OHG Administrative Assistant.

1.5 The membership roster will be made available to the members on a basis established by Copper Mountain. The membership roster is proprietary to Copper Mountain, and in no event shall it be used for commercial solicitation or for any other purposes except those relating to OHG activities unless specific written approval has been obtained from Copper Mountain. Failure to follow this rule shall be cause for termination of membership in OHG.

1.6 OHG provides significant privileges to its members and these privileges, together with the nametags worn by OHG members make them visible representatives of OHG and of Copper Mountain. Thus OHG members have a responsibility to act in a courteous and respectful manner to all patrons and employees of Copper Mountain. Copper Mountain may expel a member of OHG whose conduct is detrimental to the interests and contrary to the beliefs of the OHG or Copper Mountain.

II. - Guests Policy

2.1 Each member may bring one or two guests per day upon prior reservation. Skiing with OHG on regular ski days as a guest shall be limited to two times during a season. The partner of an OHG guide may be a guest up to four times. In addition, administrative guests may be designated by the OHG Program Supervisor or OHG Administrative Assistant.

2.2 Everyone who shows up at the OHG morning lineup must have and display one of the following: a current Copper OHG nametag, a current membership card or a Copper Mountain season pass that has OHG membership signified on it. Guests will be issued a guest badge. The guides have been instructed to verify the above prior to leaving the lineup. International OHG or

other nametags are not an acceptable alternative to the Copper Mountain OHG nametag. If the member chooses to wear a nametag other than the Copper Mountain OHG badge, that badge should not be worn on the outer garment.

2.3 A member must have a reservation in order to bring a guest. Reservations (48 hours in advance) may be made through the OHG Administrative Assistant at (970) 968- 2318 x 60886 or (970) 968-3059 or email to OHG@coppercolorado.com. There is a limit of 20 guests/day. The member will be issued a guest badge for his or her guest.

2.4 Members must ski in the same group with their guests. For instance, if the guest opts for the True Blue level and the member is Club Incline, he or she will ski at the True Blue level. This does not apply to OHG guide partners nor to administrative guests.

2.5 Guests must be at least 16 years of age. Exceptions may be granted as appropriate by the OHG Program Supervisor.

2.6 Guests are allowed only at regular ski days at Copper Mountain and at off-the-hill outdoor activities and social events.

III. - Ski-Day Operations

3.1 Unless otherwise designated by the OHG Program Supervisor, skiers will meet, ready to ski, at 8:50 a.m. on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Saturdays of each official ski day and at 9:50 a.m. on Sunday of each official ski day at a place designated by the OHG Program Supervisor.

3.2 Guides will be recruited, trained, scheduled, supervised and assigned through the Copper Mountain Ski School.

3.3 Skiers and riders will make their own initial selection of ski group within which to ski according to their ability and type of skiing desired. Guides may move skiers into groups which are appropriate ability levels. The judgment of the guide will be considered final in determining who skis with what group.

3.4 Groups will be limited to a safe and manageable size as determined by the OHG Program Supervisor or his designee.

3.5 The OHG Program Supervisor or his designee will be responsible for assigning guides to each group at the beginning of the day with adjustments as necessary at the lunch break.

3.6 The OHG Program Supervisor or his designee will be responsible for on-hill supervision and necessary assistance each official ski day. Guide evaluation forms will be available from the OHG Program Supervisor or at lunch for use by the members.

3.7 Those skiing with OHG generally eat lunch together and, when possible, have reserved seating in a Copper Mountain facility. The OHG Program Supervisor shall determine the lunch location and schedule and communicate that to the guides and membership. Each skier is responsible for his or her own lunch.

3.8 Après-ski socials will be held at approximately 3:00 p.m. unless otherwise noted by the OHG Program Supervisor or his designee each official ski day except Sundays. The après-ski socials are subject to cancellation by the OHG Program Supervisor or his designee if sufficient interest is not expressed by those members attending on a day-to-day basis. Arrangements for the après-ski socials will be made by the OHG Program Supervisor or his designee.

3.9 Official ski days will be set by the OHG Program Supervisor prior to the beginning of the season after consultation with the Board .

IV. - Summer and Winter Activities

4.1 Summer and winter activities, including hiking, highway pickup (Adopt-a-Highway), tennis, golf, biking, snowshoeing, tubing and theatre, among others, will be coordinated by the Board with such encouragement and support from Copper Mountain as Copper Mountain may see fit.

V. - Newsletters

5.1 Newsletters will be made available to each member monthly.

5.2 The names of the Board of OHG, the OHG Program Supervisor, and the OHG Administrative Assistant, together with their telephone numbers and email addresses, are to be listed in each newsletter.

5.3 The newsletter will contain current club news, information and announcements and may contain official notices to the members pursuant to the Amended By-Laws and the Revised Rules and Regulations.

VI. – Refund Policy

6.1 All refunds must be processed prior to March 1st, otherwise no refund will be given. You must produce a doctor's note in order to receive any refund. The sooner that the doctor's note is received the more money you will receive back.

- November 100% returned
- December 80%
- January 60%
- February 40%
- March 0 %

We will also withhold \$50.00 from the amount that needs to be refunded to maintain social membership and Administrative Cost. The refund will not be based on the date of the injury but on the date in which the doctor's note is turned in. Your refund for your season pass will be prorated \$40/day that you have skied that season.

VII - Effective Date - Changes

7.1 These Revised Rules and Regulations shall replace all prior Rules and Regulations and shall become effective upon adoption by the Board and upon approval by Copper Mountain.

7.2 These Revised Rules and Regulations may be changed from time to time by the Board upon approval by Copper Mountain.
